This is stored (as IPTC?? have to find this out, seems to be correct) within the picture. It seems to be part of Dublin Core properties (which is good, where the same set of IMDI) (see in attachment IPTCinCS02.jpg). Disadvantage of using this method is the high amount of system resources needed by Photoshop. So it may not be the fastest method if yor pc is slow.
